Science: Forces and magnets

Key facts:

Magnets have invisible magnetic fields which attract and stick onto steel items.

One end of a 'bar' magnet is a north pole and the opposite end is a South Pole.

The North Pole of one magnet will repel and push away the North Pole of another magnet.

Forces are just pushes and pulls in a particular direction.

Friction is a force between two surfaces that are sliding, or trying to slide, across each other.

Key vocabulary:

North and South pole, repel, force, push, pull, friction, resistance and gravity.

Key facts:

There are 10 ones in ten. There are ten tens in 100. Numbers can be represented in different ways. Estimation is a rough calculation of the value, number, and quantity of something. There is a connection between the 5 and 50 times tables.
