Topic

In our topic, we will think about people that help us. Why are these people so important today? We will study significant individuals from the past and how they have helped us to have better lives. We will come up with ideas as to how we can help ourselves and other people, working towards our ultimate goal of collectively completing 100 acts of kindness, remembering Captain Sir Tom Moore who walked 100 times around his garden raising money to help people in the NHS.


