



## This term's Big Question:

## Overview

This term, we will be exploring the outdoor areas of the school and looking at all of the plants and trees that are growing. The basic structure of a plant will be investigated and we will be finding out what the key elements are that a plant needs to survive. The children will be looking at seed/flower catalogues and how information is presented and will be creating their own catalogues to display in the class garden centre. We will also be identifying deciduous and evergreen trees both in Forest school.

## Topic: Plants

### Key facts:

- An evergreen tree remains green all year round.


