

Principal's News

Dear Parents/Carers

This term we are having a focus on Reading. We all know that reading is an essential life skill and therefore we want all of our pupils to be the strongest possible reader they can be by the time they leave Harriers. In school we have daily reading lessons, daily phonics/spelling (some classes have phonics twice a day), class book sessions where an adult reads to the class, DEAR (drop everything and read), Accelerated Reader (where children can guiz on books they have read in school and at home), Lexia (a computer support program that helps children improve their reading if they are reading below their reading age) and a wide variety of other reading interventions.

Teaching reading is a team effort. There is clear evidence that shows the wider a child's vocabulary is then the better their reading will be. This can be supported by reading to your child every day (even older children), having conversations at breakfast and dinner time and making sure your child is able to talk in full sentences. These small actions will have a massive impact on a child's vocabulary and therefore their reading, not to mention yours and their wellbeing.



The poster demonstrates the impact of what being read to daily has on a child's vocabulary. Once a day can add a quarter of a million words! As a parent, that certainly made me make sure I never skip a bedtime story!

Upper Phase	10.50am - 11.05am (Monday - Friday)







Chocolate Rocks!



Year 3 classes have been having great fun whilst learning about the three different rock types.

The children squeezed melted chocolate out as if it was molten rock

in a volcano and let it cool and go hard like **igneous rock**.

They used grated white and dark chocolate to make 'sediment', layered it on top of each other, and then used pressure to form **sedimentary rock**.

Finally, they put the igneous and sedimentary rock together and used pressure and heat to squeeze it together to form **metamorphic rock**.

Changes to Covid-19 guidance

The government Plan B restrictions ended on Thursday 27th January. We have also seen a reduction in Covid cases in school over the past week. We have therefore agreed with our staff on the following changes:

- Masks are optional outside for staff and continue to be so for parents
- Mask are optional in communal areas for staff and visitors
- Assemblies will return to the hall, in phases, and parents will be invited to Celebration Assemblies
- Year groups will no longer be in bubbles at break, lunch or after school club
- Extra curricular clubs with mixed year groups can start
- Penguin Club carousel of activities can restart

Other activities, such as school events, will be decided upon on an individual basis.

These measures will be reviewed on a weekly basis, based on the Covid rates in school. Staff will continue to do LFD tests twice a week. Children with symptoms must isolate and get a PCR test. Any close contacts must do a LFD test daily for 7 days. After a positive test (PCR or LFD), the isolation period is now 5 days (subject to a negative LFD on day 5 and day 6).
