

For many of our year 2 children, this was their first ever trip on a train! The children loved the journey and had fun comparing a town with a village. They also loved the park!








### Year 3






# Year 4 science week!


Year 5 really enjoyed the workshop and visit to the Heroes of the Viking World exhibition at Banbury Museum this week.












### Butterflies
