



Subject Specific Vocabulary (Tier 3)	
Latitude	Lines of latitude circle Earth from East to West, parallel to the Equator.
Longitude	Lines of longitude circle Earth from North to South.
Equator	The Equator is an imaginary line around the Earth that goes exactly midway between the North Pole and the South Pole.
Northern Hemisphere	The Northern Hemisphere is the northern half of the Earth above the Equator.
Southern Hemisphere	The Southern Hemisphere is the southern half of the Earth below the Equator.
Prime Meridian	The prime meridian is the imaginary line that divides Earth into two equal parts.
Map Scale	The relationship between distance on the map and distance in real life.
Human Geography	Human Geography focuses on where people live, what they do, and how they use the land.
Physical Geography	Physical Geography is the study of the Earth's natural features, such as mountains, rivers, deserts and oceans.
Coordinates	The two numbers on a grid identifying a specific position.
Capital	A capital is a city where a region's government is located.
Brexit	Brexit is the United Kingdom's departure from the European Union.
