



Year 2 had a lovely time enjoying the outdoors as part of children's mental health week. We built minibeast houses linking to our learning about habitats.
























































Year 4 had an amazing Forest School session for their 'Extreme Survival' topic!

#### Primary school place - you must apply now

If your child was born on or between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019, you need to apply for a primary school place now.

You must still apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school.

Deadline for applications is 15 January 2023.




