We have been investigating buoyancy (water resistance). The children have discovered that shape matters if you want an object to take longer to sink in water.

They worked hard in teams to put together their projects outlining their learning, including how their investigation was a fair test.





Thank you to The Curiosity Box for sending us some fantastic activities to do! Year 5 children had the opportunity to build elastic band operated cars!

We also took part in the NFU Science Farm Live during which we learnt lots of really interesting facts about farming and how sheep are connected to seaweed!

Year 5 have also taken part in planting hedging trees in the grounds.





Year 6 had such a packed week, full of science, speech writing and even doing their part for the planet and community.

Throughout science week year 6 have had the chance to explore many different areas from buoyancy to forces, even considering how sheep can be linked to space and seaweed!

Year 6 also took part in planting hedging trees along the school gate to make it a greener place for all!

Keeping our children safe online

It It is really important to understand why platforms have certain age restrictions.

Age Restrictions for Social Media Platforms s the minimum age for account holders se social media sites and apps.

Often it is because of the content children could be exposed to on the platform not necessarily what they access themselves.

A good example of this is that we had an incident of a student talking about an adult streaming site this week. They had no idea what the site contained, however they were referencing it because they had heard a streamer talking about it. It is really important that parents are aware of the content their children are exposed to.

Whilst many of these streamers may seem innocuous. They can often discuss adult themes which are a wholly inappropriate for a younger audience




