# Message from Mrs Coley



Welcome back to a new year at Harriers and a very warm welcome to all of our new pupils, their families and members of staff in particular. The term has started well with our youngest children enjoying their transition into school and now being fully fledged members of the Harriers' community. Our Conditions this term are "Belonging" and "Fun & Excitement" and our whole school focus across this year is "Being Kind." Ask your children about "Filling their bucket" or "Filling the bucket of Others."

At the end of last term, Mrs Ross was successful in her bid for Harriers to win a "Bold Ideas" grant from our Trust, to build a "Storytelling" Garden. Our Storytelling Council and Eco Council members played a crucial part in supporting the bid with a video explaining why it would be such an amazing place. More details about this project will follow shortly.

We have started back with a real focus on attendance. Last year, The attendance at Harriers was below the National Average of 92.5% and our "Persistent Absence" (defined by the Department for Education as missing 10% or more of possible school sessions or around 19 days per academic year) level was above the National Average of 22.3%. It is absolutely vital that if your child/children are well enough to attend school, they MUST do so. The impact of not attending is far reaching, including their progress in school, their wellbeing and their self-esteem. Mrs Stephens, our Home-School Link Worker (HSLW), will contact you if we start to see patterns in absence from school for your children. Please make sure they attend every day unless they are truly unwell.

We have enjoyed getting to know our daily routines and we are fantastic at our CALM corridors! If you don't know what a CALM corridors means, then ask your child to explain it to you!










In Year 1, we have started our English text for this term. It is called 'The Adventures of Egg Box Dragon'.

We have loved examining the rocks and are now keen rock spotters around school!









Year 4 have really enjoyed learning all about the seven continents, the equator and oceans around the world this week! Ask your children to tell you about them.

# Keeping our children safe online

Pupils in KS1 and KS2 have been discussing and signing our Computing Acceptable
Use Policy/Agreement, which covers their use of technology within school.

You may want to talk about how these guidelines could be useful to you as a family too.

#### I will:

- Always follow the instructions of the adult in class
- ⊙ Only do activities and use apps that an adult says are ok
- © Keep my personal information private
- Ask before taking or sharing photos or videos
- Always tell an adult if I see something that upsets me
- Take care of the ICT equipment I use
- Be polite and respectful online, but also remember that it is ok to say No!\*
- \* For example: I can say "No" if I don't want to have my photo taken, to be friends online with someone, or to share something online


