Nursery

Nursery have been enjoying the start of our topic about Fairy Tales. We made stick men in forest school using wool and googly eyes.

We have also made gingerbread men. We made sure that we measured all the ingredients accurately. Then we decorated them with lots of different sprinkles!









Early Years

We have started thinking about what the greatest dinosaur might be by going dinosaur spotting, finding out about sharp toothed, sharp clawed carnivores, plant eating herbivores and omnivores. We have looked at floating and sinking and made stegosaurus sandwiches!

We have also created collaborative firework art.

In Maths, we have compared more than, fewer than and equal amounts.



Year 1 started off Term 2 with a visit from the Fire Service.

They brought their fire engine for us to look inside, told us about how to keep safe if there is a fire and even let us spray the water from the hose!



Year 2 have been experimenting with mark making techniques using charcoal.

We have tried using 'rough, soft, light, hard, tiny and enormous'.

We can't wait to make some pictures with these techniques!

We have also created posters of animals in their habitats which we have been learning about in our science lessons.


















Year 3 have been learning about forces and magnets, they have made predictions about whether things are magnetic or not and then tested to find out the results!

Year 3 have really enjoyed improving their skills in balancing and yoga this term!

In Kingfishers, the children enjoyed a conker tournament! There were some tough battles fought. We are also enjoying experimenting with charcoal and pencil in Art.







The Year 4 pupils have been really enjoying our class text this term!

This week, we read another chapter of 'The Adventures of Odysseus' and the pupils drew some brilliant pictures! They included the characters and the setting of the chapter!

Year 5

Year 5 have spent some time learning about the water cycle. We then created a representation of the water cycle which you may have seen attached to our windows!





Pelicans Class enjoyed a visit to Banbury Canal to look at the features and uses today. The children also enjoyed learning about the history of canals at Banbury Museum.









We have been learning about how light travels. We spoke about how, on submarines, they use a periscope. They are able to this by

using the law of reflection This means that when light hits a surface it will reflect off at the same angle.

In dance this week we collaborated in groups to create a piece using claps and stamps.

Some of our children have really attended a dodgeball and hockey festival at Wykham Park Academy. Mr Gledhill has been so impressed with the resilience, teamwork, behaviour and attitudes of all our children and we are very proud of them.









Keeping our children safe

Vaping is not safe for children. Please talk to your children about the risks involved and urge family/friends not to smoke or vape around children.

Vaping and associated harms on children and young people

- E-cig /Vape use is NOT harmless
- The long-term risks of vaping for CYP are still largely unknown
- E-cigarette use and nicotine dependency in adolescents, has been linked to number of physical, oral and mental health problems but more research is needed
- For every admission linked to vaping among those under 20, there are 125 admissions for children caused by tobacco smoke exposure.

What kinds of information should I keep to myself when I use the internet?


How can a strong password help protect your privacy?
