Dear Parents and Carers,

As many of you will be aware, online safety has become even more of a hot topic in recent years. Many children are very lucky to have technology at their fingertips at home. There are a huge amount of benefits to allowing children access to these sites. However, there are some negative impacts. Now, children can go home and communicate with each other easily, which can lead to cyberbullying.

As parents & carers, what can you do to support?

1. Check your child's devices as they are able to communicate with each other and strangers via many commonly used games and apps e.g. Roblox.

2. Coach your child on what to do if someone is unkind.

We have begun to create our own Monet inspired art scrapbooks!


We have also been playing the recorder!

Coffee and Chat


Support group for parents and carers of children with SEN at Harriers School
