This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

### Part A: Curriculum Music

Our music curriculum at Harriers Banbury Academy follows a hybrid music scheme, incorporating the guidance of the Model Music curriculum into our provision. We use resources from BBC Ten Pieces, Charanga and instrument units (recorders, glockenspiels and ukuleles) to engage and teach our pupils in an exciting way.

These fortnightly sessions embed the pupils' knowledge across the music curriculum; understanding music, listening, singing, notation, playing instruments, composition, improvisation and performance.

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## Part B: Extra-Curricular Music

Harriers is lucky to offer lots of musical provisions and opportunities beyond the classroom.

These include:

- Harriers Got Talent – a yearly event in which pupils get to audition for and take part in a whole-school show.
- Banbury Young Singers – a local free choir after-school, run and funded by the Oxfordshire County Music Service for pupils in Years 4 to 6.

Pop Choir is an after-school club run by an experienced teaching assistant and our Harriers Orchestra is run by a teacher with specialist knowledge. Both clubs had the opportunity to perform at our annual KS2 Carol Concert. All other music lessons on offer take place during the school day, with some free lessons available for pupil premium students.

- Tell Your Story Festival participation – Year 4 pupils had the opportunity to take part in a festival with the Cherwell Theatre Company, creating an original song with a facilitator. The pupils performed their song to the school and at the Mill Arts Centre.
- Phase Assemblies about famous and poignant musicians – The Beatles, Mozart.
- Different musical genres and composers played at the start of each weekly Celebration assembly.
